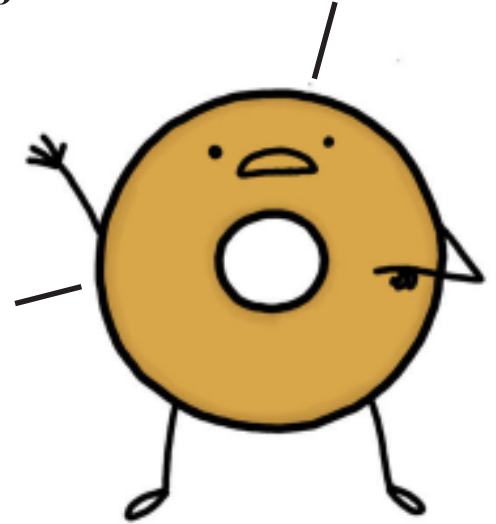

Manager's Corner

June, 2011

This month's occupancy is 270 or 15% vs. 585 for the month prior and 363 for the year prior. There are 8 renters currently in the park.

The re-plastering of the East Pool is scheduled to start June 1st. The east pool will be drained and work will start on this project. You can expect that this project will take at least 30 days. While this work is in progress, we will keep the exercise facility open but the spas will be shut down. As long as everyone stays behind the construction zone, we will be able to do this. If however, we have people that enter into the construction area, we will be forced to close the entire pool area down. Please, for you own safety and for your neighbor's convenience, stay out of the construction areas. When the deck is being painted the entire area will be shut down for a few days.

The roof on the Laundry room and ceramics building is scheduled for replacement that also should take place in June.

The street resurfacing will start the second week of June. Fairchild and Helio will be completely re-surfaced. Some seal coating will also be done in the park, on selected streets where the seal coating is wearing off. We are going to try a different method of application on the seal coat, only applying in the very early morning hours, (5:00 a.m. start time) to take advantage of the cooler temperatures. The Seal Master Representatives say this meets their specifications and they have found that the wear on the seal coat is better if it is applied at night when the temperatures are cooler. In the past, the seal coat was going down in the heat of the day when the radiant temperatures exceeded 150 – 165 degrees on the asphalt. They feel that this is detrimental to the product and could be a factor in how quickly the seal coat oxidizes off the streets. Arizona's extreme temperatures make this product react differently than it would in any other part of the country.

Palm tree trimming, will start towards the end of June. We always wait until most of the seed pods are out so that the contractor doesn't have to go around the park twice to catch those pods. We also have some trees that flower much later than others, (along Navajo) so we have to time the trimming to not catch these trees too early.

SRP came back to us a couple of weeks ago and told us that they had decided to do some additional surveying in the park, again at no cost to VO. This survey will mark the location of the primary and secondary lines to the rear of the units. This will be extremely beneficial, as SRP often loses many man hours trying to locate their services. They will be marking the paths of these lines, using 'whisker pins' or water soluble paint. We ask that you leave these markers alone. Once they are done they will complete the survey and it will be much more detailed when done. When this new survey map is complete, we will have it posted in a prominent location in the post office. We will also be given a PDF file of this survey, which would allow us to zero in on a specific lot, blow it up and 'take a picture' of that lot for the lot owners use. When doing construction it is still necessary to contact Blue Stake services. In fact if you didn't contact Blue Stake and there was an accident with SRP's utilities there is NO COVERAGE, so make sure you always contact them prior to digging ANY time.

We are currently working on our new web site. There is much that has to be done on this site and it involves all departments. We hope to have it up and running very soon, so that the Bulletin Board will be back in business. The old bulletin board was very much a problem for our service provider (she had to field constant complaints from the residents) and since we are taking this all in house, we have to make sure we have a board that is user friendly, so it does not become a burden to this office to service it.

The offices will be closed on Memorial Day – Monday, May 30st.

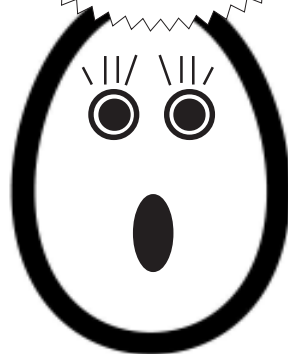








VENTURE OUT WORSHIP NEWS
